

TSOWA FACT SHEET

- LOCATION -

Tsowa Island is situated in the Zambezi National Park, a 56 000 ha game reserve which is also a renowned birding hot spot of 400 different species and home to lion, elephant, buffalo, giraffe, sable and numerous antelope. Zambezi National Park stretches from the Victoria Falls approximately 50 km upstream.

Tsowa Island is 1.5 km long and 400m wide and is dissected by a small river where a pair of Pel's Fishing Owls reside. The island, which has never been inhabited, is fringed by lush forests while the mainland is riverine woodland with natural spring lines which are hidden gems used by wildlife. This scenically beautiful area is popular for both landscape and wildlife photography. It is a particularly scenic game reserve for guided walking.

- DIRECTIONS -

FROM VICTORIA FALLS AIRPORT OR VICTORIA FALLS TOWN

Guests are transferred in a closed air-conditioned vehicle (operated by local transfer company) from Victoria Falls Airport (47km – 50mins) OR Victoria Falls town (27km – 30min) to our private entrance to the Zambezi National Park.

From there they are transferred in our open game viewer 4x4 vehicle on a sand road (12km – 20min) to the banks of the Zambezi River overlooking Tsowa Island, which is a 3 minute boat crossing in our island river cruiser.

FROM KASANE, BOTSWANA

Transfers are offered from Kasane. Guests are transferred to the border post in a closed air-conditioned vehicle (operated by local transfer company) (12kms-20 mins from Kasane).

Guests walk through the border post and alight a second vehicle (operated by local transfer company as it is a lengthy procedure for vehicles to cross the border post). They travel 30kms – 30 mins from the border post to our private entrance to the Zambezi National Park, where they are transferred to an open game viewer 4x4 vehicle and driven for the last 12 kms – 20 mins on a sand road to the banks of the Zambezi River overlooking Tsowa Island, which is a 3 minute boat crossing in our island river cruiser.

Victoria Falls Airport to Tsowa Island - 1hr 15mins
Victoria Falls Town to Tsowa Island - 1hr
Kasane to Tsowa Island - 1hr 15min depending on border crossing time
Chobe to Tsowa Island - 1hr 30min depending on border crossing time
Livingstone to Tsowa Safari Island - 2.5 hr depending on border crossing time

- THE CAMP -

This modern day explorer's tented camp is situated under a cool canopy of magnificent trees of an island forest, a calming welcome after the hustle and bustle of busy Victoria Falls International Airport.

This intimate camp has only 12 guests on safari and is uniquely personable.

- MAIN AREA -

Stretch Bedouin tents with timber frames and sides on wooden decks situated under massive Jackalberry trees, overlooking the Zambezi River. The area comprises a lounge and dining area for 12 guests.

The bar tent is adjacent to this main living area. The outside deck area, which is also in the cool forest, has a dining area flowing onto a sunken fire pit which overlooks the river. The main area is linked to the pool area which overlooks the river and is situated in a sunny spot.



- BEDROOMS -

The large airy safari tents are nestled on the edge of the island on the banks of the Zambezi River under the shade of deep forest.

Each tent has a small covered verandah set on the river's edge and looks directly across to the Zambezi National Park on the mainland. Wildlife frequents the water's edge in the late afternoon and early morning. The en-suite bathrooms have a large indoor shower and a separate outdoor shower.

- LODGE SERVICE -

This small intimate camp offers an authentic wilderness experience with the comforts of a modern-day explorer's camp, emphasis on personal service and a range of water and land based activities run by local knowledgeable guides. The camp will appeal to guests wanting an intimate and personal safari experience in a small camp with specialised guides.

- ACTIVITIES INCLUDE -

Game drives Game drives are offered through this scenically beautiful national

park in the early mornings. The game drives are approximately 3 to 4 hours and include a refreshment stop. The Zambezi National Park is home

to large herds of elephant, buffalo, lion, hyena, giraffe and numerous

antelope species.

Game walks are offered on the mainland which is considered a prime

walking safari area.

Canoeing Available year-round, canoeing is done in two man inflatables

and is offered from mid-morning to early afternoon, guests will be accompanied by guides also in inflatables. This fun activity is a great way to spend an adventurous afternoon. Guest leave from the island in their boats and have lunch and drinks en-route on the banks of the river. The take out point is approximately 1.5 hrs downstream. Guest are be transported back to the island in

an open 4x4 game viewing vehicle

River Cruise The river cruise is offered in the late afternoon to enjoy the

spectacular sunsets along the Zambezi River. Guest can enjoy drinks and snacks with our guides on our comfortable river cruiser while keeping an eye out for game coming down to drink.

Island Walks Guided 1 hour walks (or longer if required) are

offered daily to the magnificent centre of the island, home to century old Baobab trees. Rare ground lilies flower early in the year while a tranquil river runs through the island where a pair of breeding Pel's Fishing owl"s reside in a Mangosteen tree. The bird life along the waters edge includes African Finfoot and

Schalow's Turaco.

Day trips to Victoria Falls

These trips are outsourced to a private company. Guest are

collected from our private entrance to the Zambezi National Park

and taken to the town of Victoria Falls

where they can view the splendid Victoria Falls, take high tea at

the Victoria Falls Hotel, enjoy river rafting on the Zambezi River, bungee

jumping and visits to the local curio shops and markets.

- RATE INCLUDES -

Accommodation, all meals (brunch, high tea and dinner), teas and coffees, bottled water, soft drinks, local beers, local wines, sparkling wines, non-premium brand spirits, laundry, 1 game drive per day, game walks, sunset cruise, canoeing, guided island walks, one return day-trip to Victoria Falls.
