PASSPORT AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

To enter South Africa/Zimbabwe, all foreign nationals need a passport valid for at least 30 days after the intended date of departure. Ensure that your passport has at least two blank visa pages for entry stamps. Check your country's visa requirements with the South African/Zimbabwean embassy.

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- Travellers arriving in South Africa are advised to declare their electronic equipment, including cameras and laptops, even if they intend to take these items with them upon their departure from South Africa.

MALARIA



- Rhino Ridge Safari Lodge and Thonga Beach Lodge are considered to be situated in low-risk malaria areas.
- Tsowa Safari Island is considered to be situated in an area where malaria is considered to be endemic to the region.
- Insect repellent is provided in all rooms at all our lodges.
- Mosquito nets are provided in all rooms at Tsowa Safari Island, Thonga Beach Lodge and in our Bush Villas at Rhino Ridge Safari Lodge.

MEDICATION

- Please seek advice from your medical practitioner for anti-malaria medication before you travel. Remember, some medications require you to start taking the medication before arrival.
- Please remember to bring enough of your own personal medication, including anything necessary for allergies or other chronic conditions you may have. Our lodges are remotely situated, and the nearest pharmacy is a long drive away.



SAFETY ON SAFARI



Participating in game drives and walking safaris is entirely safe, provided you adhere to the guidelines communicated by your guide. It's important to bear in mind that we are mere visitors in the bush environment and must respect its fauna and flora at all times. Do not touch, feed, or approach any wild animals and always seek approval from your guide before leaving the vehicle to ensure a safe experience.
